Illinois Farm Bureau will host a series of twohour programs focusing on transportation laws and regulations as they pertain to the agricultural industry.

Rock Island County Farm Bureau will host one of the sessions on Tuesday, February 27th at 10:00 a.m. at the Camden Centre in Milan.

The Rules for the Road Seminar will cover recent changes, as well as some of the more established but still misunderstood rules. Topics may include the USDOT Number, UCR registration, Entry Level Driver Training, farm exemptions, and driver's license classifications to name a few. In addition, one of the events will also be broadcast virtually on March 5th at 10 am. "These presentations take a closer look at the rules and provide an opportunity for farmers to ask ag-related trucking questions that they can't seem to find clear answers for," said Rodney Knittel, IFB Associate Director of Transportation and Infrastructure.

Knittel specializes in farm transportation issues and will lead the seminar series and will be joined by

Illinois enforcement agencies.

Rules for the Road seminars are open to all Illinois Farm Bureau members. Dr. Annie Kinwa-Muzinga is a Professor of Agribusiness in Agribusiness in the Regina Roth Applied Agricultural and Food Studies Department at Morningside University since August 2018. Dr. Annie Kinwa-Muzinga's research on Gender Assessment of the Agricultural Sector in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) in 2012 helped her understand that the fight against hunger and malnutrition of one widow and her children.

Leader Tony McCombie will be the featured mid-day speaker. In January 2023, Leader McCombie began her fourth term of office as State Representative and first term as Leader of the House. and Safety, Advocacy, Local Affairs, Engagement and Outreach, Membership Value, Foundations and Fundraising, Young Leaders and Harvest for All.


Rock Island County Farm Bureau was recently awarded the following:

- Most Outstanding Program in Advocacy for Conversations and Combine Rides. This was a program we did in the Fall of 2022 with the Rock Island County Board. We worked with the chairman and scheduled 1-hour visits on our directors' farms with the county board directors. They had the opportunity to ride in a combine and experience first-hand what harvest looks like. This program allowed the opportunity for one-on-one conversations with our directors about their farms, issues that are important to them and how we can work together for the betterment of our county as a whole.
- Most Outstanding Program in Engagement and Outreach for Family Farmapalooza. This was a program that was done with the Rock Island Soil & Water Conservation District in July. It was a free event that was marketed toward our non-ag residents. Attendees had the opportunity to fish, see production livestock in person, go on a nature hike through

the managed timber, view various pieces of farm equipment, take a hayrack ride around the farm, learn about cover crops, try their hand at archery, visit a pollinator plot, see a streambank stabilization table and spin a wheel for ag trivia. Presentations were also given on soil health and conservation practices. The event finished up with a free hog roast meal.
