Bin safety program successful

GET OUT

The Rock Island and Mercer County Farm Bureaus partnered with the Illinois Fire Service Institute and Sherrard FFA to host "Farmers and First Responders," a grain bin safety program on Saturday, Sept. 12, at Sherrard High School. The program included a hands-on, live simulation grain bin entrapment demonstration provided by the Illinois Fire Service Institute. Two sessions were held: 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. to 3 p.m. to accommodate all who wanted to attend.

The movie "Silo" was shown digitally on Thursday and Friday evenings before the event.

Farmers and first responders from Rock Island and Mercer counties were invited to attend this free event. Between the two sessions, about 55 people attended.

Representatives from 11 fire departments were present. Attendees heard stories and statistics and learned about different entrapment situations. IFSI trainer Dave Newcomb then led a hands-on demonstration where attendees used a grain rescue tube to rescue a dummy trapped in a bin full of corn. Firefighters also learned proper technique for cutting into a grain bin during a rescue situation.
