Since its inception 12 years ago, farmers in Rock Island, Henry, and Mercer counties have been feeding people in our community through the Bushels for Hunger program. Thank you!

This year, the River Bend Food Bank invites you to consider donating grain through the Bushels for Hunger program. Through the relationship between your Farm Bureau and local grain elevator,

you can donate a portion of your harvest to feed people facing hunger in your community. In the past 12 years, the Bushels for Hunger program has provided over 1.25 million meals!

Here's how it works:

When you unload your crop at the grain elevator, tell the clerk you would like to donate XX number of bushels to the Bushels for Hunger program. The donated grain will be sold and the money earned will be donated to the

A gift of grain is a unique and generous way to make a charitable gift. For farm operators, gifting grain directly, rather than selling the grain and making a gift from the proceeds, may provide significant tax savings. Contributing grain

allows you to avoid recognizing the sale of the commodity as income, while the production costs may still be deductible. Reducing taxable income may provide advantages such as minimizing or eliminating self-employment tax and reducing adjusted gross income.


